




From safeguarding our peace to protecting the vulnerable, discover what it means to be a police officer.

You need to have the confidence and decisiveness to act under pressure, and make the right calls with precision. You must be a leader, moulding a team that will instil confidence in your community.


Above all, you must have the heart to protect the nation, and be passionate in our shared calling of safeguarding every day.

TRAINING

Your career will begin with a 9-month residential training programme. You will undergo a well-structured curriculum that includes police defence tactics, physical training, lessons in criminal law, as well as leadership development.

You will also undergo criminal investigation lessons and further leadership training, which includes an overseas segment.

FOUNDATIONAL

Upon completion of your training, you will have the opportunity to receive hands-on experience with regular rotations within various functional areas of the Force. Your career will follow a well-structured track that grooms you for future command appointments:

Frontline Policing: As a Ground Response Force Officer, partner the community in our fight against crime.

Investigation: As an Investigation Officer, solve a full spectrum of crimes - establish the truth and set wrongs right.

Command: As a Team Leader, lead a group of purpose-driven officers to achieve the SPF Vision - to make Singapore the safest place in the world.

Staff: As a Staff Officer, plan and implement policies to support frontline operations and develop the Force's long-term capabilities.

INSPECTOR ANG XIN YAN

Tanglin Division

THOROUGH AND THOUGHTFUL

Inspector (Insp) Ang's job requires him to pay careful attention to facts and evidence. He shared, "Often, there is only one golden opportunity for you to collect the required evidence and confront the accused person. Missing out on such opportunities may result in the case being thrown out of court or give the accused person a chance to find a loophole that benefits himself instead."

However, Insp Ang knows that being compassionate is also part of the job. He once tried to help an alcoholic who had committed family violence. Working with a social worker, he attempted to persuade him to find a job and seek help. It was this very sense of compassion and thoroughness that led to him receiving the CP's Commendation Award.

A CAREER THAT SHAPES YOU

Inspector (Insp) Lee grew up listening to her mother (who is herself a Senior Staff Sergeant in the SPF) share about her life in the Force, and how it shaped her as a person. These stories helped Insp Lee see how dedicated our police officers are in keeping our homes safe, and ultimately inspired her to serve as a police officer.

Under her parents' upbringing, she became a disciplined individual that helped ease her in to the training regime and job. Her mother, speaking from years of experience, said that she firmly believes that while policing work has become more challenging through the years, this is a career that helps her daughter learn useful life skills and appreciate the peace and harmony that we have now.

INVEST RETIREMENT PACKAGE

As a uniformed officer, you will also be eligible for retirement benefits under the INVEST Scheme. A contribution equivalent to 13.25% of your gross salary will be credited monthly into your retirement account, starting from your first year in service and will cease when you reach 55 years old. The monies are invested to earn investment returns. Upon retirement, you can withdraw the full sum in your account.

STRATEGIC PAYMENT SCHEME

New officers can look forward to cash payouts of 3 months (ASP and below) quantum upon reaching their 3^{rd} , 6^{th} , 9^{th} , 12^{th} , 15^{th} , 20^{th} and 25^{th} year in service.



POLICE (INVEST) PAYMENT

In recognition of the challenging nature of police work, you will also receive an annual cash payment, where the quantum of payment ranges from 0.75 months to 1.5 months as you advance up the ranks.

SIGN-ON BONUS

Direct-Entry Inspectors will receive a sign-on bonus of \$20,000 upon appointment.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What does the shift work schedule look like?

- a. Working hours vary depending on the department/unit that you are posted to. Most frontline officers work 12-hour shifts (Morning Shift, Night Shift, 1st Off, 2nd Off), subject to work exigencies.
- b. An example of a shift work schedule:

MONDAY	TUESDAY	WEDNESDAY	THURSDAY
Morning Shift (8am - 8pm)	Night Shift (8pm - 8am)	1 st Off	2 nd Off

2. What are the foundational postings and can I choose which departments/units I wish to be posted to after that?

- a. You will first be posted to a Neighbourhood Police Centre on a 6-month attachment as a Ground Response Force Officer. Thereafter, you will be posted to a Police Division as an Investigation Officer, followed by your stint as a Team Leader and finally as a Staff Officer. After completing your foundational postings, you may apply to join the unit/department of your choice, subject to your suitability for the role.
- 3. Do I need to study a relevant course for my degree to join **Direct-Entry Inspector?**
- a. No, you need only have a pass degree in any discipline. The residential training at Home Team Academy as well as an overseas leadership course will equip you with the skills and knowledge to be a police officer.
 - *The leadership course is currently done locally due to Covid-19. Updates will be given once there is a reassessment on the global

4. What is the job scope of an Investigation Officer?

- a. An Investigation Officer follows leads, conducts interviews on the ground, analyses and piece together evidence to solve cases such as a robbery, domestic dispute and harassment.
- 5. When will I be notified after I have submitted my application and what are the recruitment stages for **Direct-Entry Inspector?**
- a. Shortlisted candidates will be notified via email within 8 weeks from the date of application, where you will undergo a 5-stage selection assessment.

Stage 1	Tea Session	Interview with Assistant Director (Talent Attraction) and Manager (Recruitment)
Stage 2	Selection Assessment	Computerised psychometric testing and submission of key documents
Stage 3	Clinical Interview	One-to-one interview with a psychologist from the Police Psychological Services Department (PPSD)
Stage 4	Board Interview	Panel interview consisting of 4 to 7 panelists, made up of Commanders and Directors from various Departments/Divisions
Stage 5	Medical Examination	Medical examination with our medical partner
